**INDICTMENT**

**COUNT 1: USE OF A VEHICLE TO FACILITATE THE DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM 21 O.S. §652(B), a FELONY**

**OR IN THE ALTERNATIVE**

**COUNT 2: FELONY DISCHARGING FIREARMS 21 O.S. §1289.17A, a FELONY**

*IN THE NAME AND BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:*

By the order of the Supreme Court of Oklahoma, the Twentieth Multi-County Grand Jury was convened with its principal site to be in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma County, Oklahoma, to serve from June 27, 2023, for eighteen (18) months, or until the designated presiding judge determines the Twentieth Multi-County Grand Jury has reached reasonable completion of its investigations, but, in any event, no more than twenty-four (24) months from the commencement of its term. That said Multi-County Grand Jury of the State of Oklahoma, being composed of good and lawful men and women, legally drawn and summoned according to law, and then and there examined, impaneled, sworn, and charged according to law to diligently inquire into, and true presentment make, of all public offenses against the State of Oklahoma committed and triable within the State of Oklahoma, upon their oath, and in the name and by the authority of the State of Oklahoma, do present and find:

**COUNT 1: USE OF A VEHICLE TO FACILITATE THE DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM, 21 O.S. §652**

On or about February 12, 2023, the crime of **USING A VEHICLE TO FACILITATE THE DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM (DRIVE-BY SHOOTING)** was unlawfully and feloniously committed in Garfield County, State of Oklahoma, by **BRIAN LOVELL** who did use a vehicle to facilitate the intentional discharge of a firearm, with conscious disregard for the safety of another person or persons, contrary to the provisions of 21 O.S. 652 (B) of the Oklahoma Statutes and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.

**COUNT 2: FELONY DISCHARGING FIREARMS, 21 O.S. §1289.17A**

On or about February 12, 2023, the crime of **FELONY DISCHARGING FIREARMS (SHOOTING INTO A DWELLING)** was unlawfully and feloniously committed in Garfield County, State of Oklahoma, by **BRIAN LOVELL** who did willfully or intentionally discharge a firearm at or into a dwelling located at 3611 Reed Rd. Bison, Oklahoma, contrary to the provisions of 21 O.S. 1289.17A of the Oklahoma Statutes and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.

COUNT 1: Use of a Vehicle to Facilitate a Shooting (Drive-by shooting)- Imprisonment for a term not less than two (2) years nor exceeding life. 21 O.S. § 652 (B)

COUNT 2: Felony Discharging Firearms- Shooting into a Dwelling- Imprisonment for a term not less than two (2) years nor more than twenty (20) years. 21 O.S. §1289.17A
